# RULES & REGULATIONS

**Before preparing your exhibits for entry be sure to read the rules and regulations carefully, and follow any instructions.**

## **1. ENTRY SUBMISSION**

Entries for all categories will be accepted on Friday AUG 25/2023 from 5:00 - 9:00 PM. Only perishable food items may be submitted on Saturday AUG 26/23 from 9:00 AM - 10:00 AM. Exhibitor tags available upon submission.

## **2. ENTRY FEES**

Entry fees are \$2.00 Per Item up to \$10.00 for an unlimited amount of entries.  
Juniors - 14 Years & Under - are \$1.00 per entry up to \$5.00 for an unlimited amount of entries.

## **3. AWARDS**

Ribbons will be awarded in each class - there will be awards for the High Point Winner in each category as well as Overall High Point Winner.

**Only one entry is permitted for each person in any class (class of category).**

**No group entries are permissible.**

**Judges decisions are final.**

# ENTRY DISPLAY RULES

**Any exhibit that does not follow the display rules may be disqualified at the discretion of the Fall Fair Committee or the Judge(s).**

1. Any identification marks must be removed or covered.
2. No prize awarded is exhibit is not of sufficient merit.
3. All exhibits must have been made or grown by the exhibitor and never been previously entered in the Hudson's Hope Fall Fair.
4. All exhibits are to be judged by the standards as set out by BC Fairs, of which the Hudson's Hope Fall Fair Society is a member. Standards books are available via the website - [www.bcfairs.com](http://www.bcfairs.com) for reference.
5. All photos must be unframed and mounted on white paper - 4 x 6 sizing ONLY.
6. Judges may not exhibit in the category they have been invited to judge.
7. Vegetables must be displayed on a plate / lid / in a container, not loose on the table.
8. All home canning must be done in canning jars with snap sealed lids.

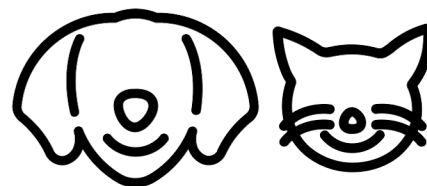

### Vegetable Specific Display Notes -

- **Beets:** Trim tops to 1/2 inch, leave roots intact.
- **Cabbages:** Stalk trimmed, 2-3 outer leaves left on.
- **Carrots:** Trim tops to 1/2 inch, no roots.
- **Kohlrabi:** Roots & leaf stem trimmed to 1/2 inch max.
- **Herbs:** Tied in bundles, even colouring.
- **Lettuce:** Clean & consistent colour, remove dying leaves.
- **Onions:** Roots & tops trimmed to 1/2 inch, dusted off.
- **Potatoes:** No green / scabs, minimal eyes, do not wash.
- **Rhubarb:** 10 inches long (min), trim leaf to 1 inch fan
- **Squash:** Trim stem to 1/2 inch
- **Tomatoes:** Leave on stems, firm, consistent colour

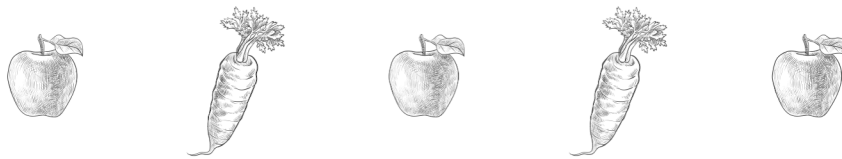

# FLOWERS, FOLIAGE & ARRANGEMENTS

## Judging Standards -

- **Form:** Uniform, proper shape, proper petalage, straightness, strength, quality, size, and proportion
- **Colour:** Uniform, intensity, clarity, brilliance
- **Condition:** Free of blemish, pests, disease, or damage

## Standards -

1. Exhibitor must be amateur (does not sell items for retail)
2. All items must be grown by or the property of the exhibitor.
3. All cut flowers are to be displayed in clear glass containers.
4. Uniformity is key - size, colour, petal count.
5. Cut stems to same length - no more than 10'.
6. Foliage, spent flowers, and seed pods are to be removed prior to display.
